What is the BIG IDEA? Big Idea Topic

Let's look at some examples:

Topic- George Washington (NOT a Big Idea)


Trivial statements about the topic: George Washington was a president

Better Big Ideas: George Washington was a president who faced difficult decisions Or

George Washington made the best choices he could at the time



Big Ideas MUST be stated in a complete sentence.

Inductive Thinking

Students take information and form a Big Idea







Deductive Thinking

Give students the Big Idea and they have to prove (or disprove) it

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Now let's try it!
